# Leprosy in the Bible

## What is leprosy?

- Leprosy is a skin disease that is caused by bacteria
- It is a "flesh eating" disease
- Leprosy is an airborne droplet disease which means it can be spread from one person to another by cough, sneeze, or even speaking
- People who have leprosy are called lepers and are kept in isolation away from the rest of the people even today
- This is a disease where people are shunned from the society and everyone

## Leprosy in the Bible

- Leprosy is mentioned both in the Old Testament and in the New Testament
- Lepers are cast outside the camp of the Israelites in the Old Testament
- In the New Testament lepers are kept outside of the city gates away from society as much as possible
- If the Jewish culture if there is a person is coming near a leper the leper must cover themselves and say "unclean, unclean" Leviticus 13:45
- Leprosy represents sin
  - Sin can eat away us so that we lose ourselves
  - It casts us away from society our family, our church, and ultimately Lord Jesus

- Luke 17: 11-19
- While the Lord was traveling he passed by ten lepers who cried unto the Lord to have mercy on them
- Lord Jesus answered them right away and asked them to go show themselves to the priest
- Only one of the ten lepers came back to worship the Lord and to thank him for all that he has done
  - We should always be thankful for what the Lord does for us and say thank you to him
